The Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA) launched its first certification program, the Certified Internal Auditor® (CIA®), in 1973, because it recognized a need to establish a level of professionalism and recognition for the internal auditor.

Since then, more than 100,000 internal audit leaders have achieved the CIA designation, still the only globally accepted certification for practitioners of internal audit and the standard by which individuals demonstrate their competency and professionalism in the internal auditing field.

SPECIALTY DESIGNATION: CGAP®

Throughout its 70+ year history, The IIA has supported auditors in every specialized field of endeavor but in 2000, after a long period of intensive focus and information gathering, a certification program was launched that encapsulated the unique requirements of government/public sector auditors.

The Certified Government Auditing Professional® certification program was designed especially for auditors working in the public sector at all levels — federal/national, state/provincial, local, quasi-governmental or crown authority — and it is an excellent professional credential that prepares you for the many challenges public sector auditors face.

Moreover, earning a designation from The IIA is more than just proof of what you know and what you've achieved — it's the best way for auditing professionals to communicate to the world that they are prepared to meet today's challenges.



The IIA considers the value of certification as a win-win-win for you, your department, and your organization. Certification assures a higher level of commitment, competence, and credibility among those who have achieved it.

There are many reasons to obtain an IIA certification. A designation from The IIA will:

STEP 1

Decide which certification is right for you. The CIA is an excellent foundational program with numerous topics of focus that will create a well-rounded knowledge base for any internal audit practitioner. It remains the standard by which individuals demonstrate their capability and expertise in the internal auditing field.

The CGAP, one of The IIA's specialty certifications, is the pinnacle of achievement for those in the specialized field of government auditing and is an excellent professional credential that prepares you for the many challenges you face in this demanding arena.

Determine your eligibility and skill level. The IIA's website, **www.globaliia.org/certification**, features a list of eligibility requirements along with sample exam questions to give you an idea of what topics are queried on the exams.

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Register for the exam. Visit www.globaliia.org/certification to determine if you are eligible to register through your local Institute or the Certification Candidate Management System (CCMS).

STEP 4

Prepare for the exam. There are abundant resources for exam candidates. You just need to choose which method suits you best: independent study, group study, or a combination of the two. Exam preparation materials and resources are available through The IIA, your local Institute, and through The IIA Research Foundation Bookstore, www.theiia.org/bookstore.


STEP 5

Take the exam. Certification exams are offered through Pearson VUE Testing Centers at more than 500 sites around the world. What's more, you will learn immediately if you achieved a passing score.
